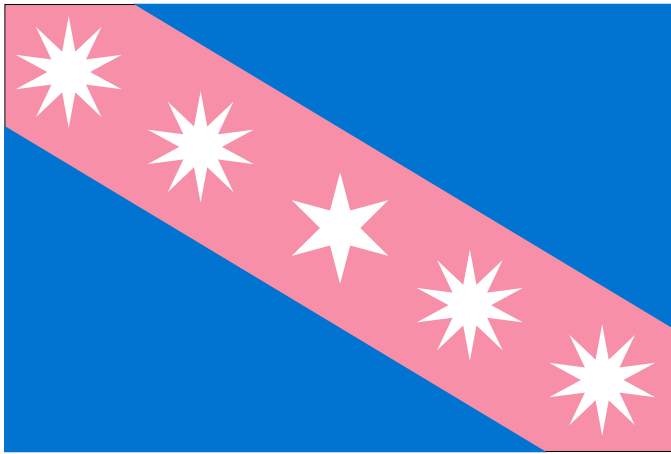
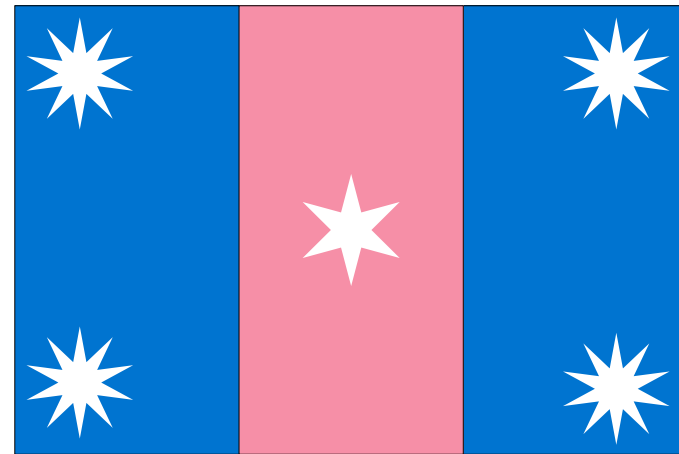


OKLAHOMA CITY FLAG REDESIGN IDEAS:

- Colors: I decided to use were White, Blue from the Oklahoma State Flag, and Pink as an homage to Oklahoma Granite and being the State's Capital City, an homage to the Pink & Black Granite, used in the State Capitol.
- Main feature: The stars. There are 46 points in total, representing Oklahoma's position as the 46th State admitted to the Union.
 - Four 10-point stars: honor the four men credited with founding Oklahoma City: Anton Classer, John Shartel, Henry Overholser, and James W. Maney.
 - One 6-point star is a graphical representation of the atom from the seal of Oklahoma City, representing "industrial and scientific future".
 - All of the stars together pay homage to the "The Five Tribes": Cherokee, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Creek, and Seminole. The orientation of the pink in the flag differs.



The orientation of this pink stripe is meant to graphically represent the orientation of both the calumet pipe and and olive branch from the Oklahoma State Flag.



The orientation of this pink stripe is meant to graphically represent the city, namely the Devon Energy Center. However, the orientation being vertical is meant to symbolize skyscrapers and high-rises normally found in the country's major cities.
